SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT (SPD)**

ADOPTION STATEMENT

In accordance with Regulation 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (As amended), notice is hereby given that the Old Deer Park Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) was formally adopted by the Council on 20 March 2018.

This SPD provides an integrated framework which supports the conservation and enhancement of the Old Deer Park as a historically important and well used recreational and community area of the borough. It considers the historic attributes of the site, the relevant planning policy framework, the recreational and community activities, environmental considerations and identifies opportunities to support its maintenance and enhancement, and provides guidance in this regard.
