## DEVELOPMENT CONTROL FOR NOISE GENERATING AND NOISE SENSITIVE DEVELOPMENT SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT (SPD)

## ADOPTION STATEMENT

In accordance with Regulation 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (As amended), notice is hereby given that the Noise Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) was formally adopted by the Council on 06 September 2018.

Local authorities are required to provide noise related policy and technical guidance which reflects local circumstances. This SPD provides a consistent approach to apply to noise generating and noise sensitive development where noise is an issue. The SPD provides interpretation of national planning and noise policy in a local context along with advice on the technical requirements that the Council regards as relevant to meeting the requirements.
