Cllr Burford	 More Kew residents voted for 20mph than in any other ward
	 TfL have agreed to put signage up on the Mortlake Road to stop lorries driving down it and getting stuck
	They are late in doing this, but it is coming shortly
	 There is lots of rubbish around Kew Village because of the events that happen around here, so we have
	had extra bins put in and are continually cleaning
	We are working on CPZ's around Kew Green

Question 1	Apart from recent upsurge in crime, am very taken aback by the volume of illegal parking in Kew Village. It amazes me that a CCTV camera can't not be installed and give people immediate fines for double parking.
	With the recent murder, knife stabbing and other theft in Kew, am sure a tragic accident is waiting to happen!
	Cllr Campanale:
	Traffic wardens should be dealing with this, they are also able to fine people for idling
	20mph is being implemented in Kew first, so we will do a push on illegal parking too
	 Fines by cameras are possible but we could go too far and have them everywhere. We do have some. When 20mph is implemented we can look at the cameras too
	We are working collectively with the Royal Botanic Gardens Kew on illegal parking
	 Despite central government cuts the Council has boosted the community safety budget by £100,000 towards local policing
	We have an excellent working relationship with law enforcement officers
	Recent incidents are unusual, the crime stats are still good for this area
	 People need to report crime so that we can get the statistics to back this up. It is no good just posting it on a forum, people need to call either 999 or 101

Response	Cllr Campanale:
	The environment is in the back of our mind in every decision we make
	We have started the Fair-Trade forum again
	We have re-written the Air Quality Plan and the Sustainability Strategy which will both be passed in July
	We intend that by 2022 the Council will be plastic free, and we are working to influence the wider community
	 Kew used to be a leading light in being plastic free – perhaps we need to re-visit that and have discussions with new shop owners too

	We cannot answer questions about central government as this conversation is about Kew
Headline Topic	: Aircraft noise and pollution campaign (Susanne Groom) Did not attend
Question 4	How can we campaign more effectively against aircraft noise and pollution?
Response	 Cllr Craigie We are doing quite a good job at this this already. The Council works together financially with several other boroughs to campaign against Heathrow. The joint judicial review with other councils in the area is under appeal. The changes of it being successful are slim, but it is about fighting the fight. Our MP is adamantly against Heathrow as are our local groups. Every button that we can press has been / is being pressed
	 Roger Mason: Heathrow Ltd are due to release the final plans soon. The Richmond Heathrow campaign are going to organise a local meeting in July (Date TBC) in Duke St Church. Please attend to find out more
Headline Topic	: Support for local traders (Angela Fenhalls) Did not attend
Question 5	Can you do more to help local traders, the life blood of the community? For example: reverse the Sandycombe Road pavement extension. Remove the additional double yellow lines. Both have affected trade. Kew Village. Parking could be revised to help traders. Motorbike/moped parking provision. They use car spaces. Kew Green shops. Provide a short-term bay. The News Agent and general supplies shop on Mortlake Terrace provide a valuable service. One could purchase more heavy items, rather than go further afield.
Response	 Cllr Campanale: The previous administration put in the crossing and there are no plans to reverse it We can look at putting a motorcycle bay in but there would have to be a demonstrable demand for it As Cllr Burford has explained – there will be a review on parking around Kew Green When 20mph is introduced and more people walk to work and school, there is evidence that there is an increase in spending in local shops
	Cllr Burford: • We have no jurisdiction over Mortlake Road as it is owned by TfL
ACTION	Cllr Campanale: Look into installation of motorcycle bay
Headline Tonic	: Bonfire ban on allotments (Angela Fenhalls) Did not attend

Response	 Cllr Campanale: The Scrutiny Committee unanimously voted to ban bonfires on allotments, which was then fully backed by the full council Officers are working with BRAG to look into how to dispose of garden waste
	 Cllr Craigie: We are ahead of the time – it is only a matter of time before the Mayor of London Sadiq Khan brings this ban in across London. Bonfires are quite cariogenic.
Supplementary Question	Is it permitted to have a bonfire in one's own garden? Is it possible for the Council to ban these?
Supplementary Answer	Cllr Campanale: • Yes, it is currently legal, however watch this space
Headline Topic : V	Vaste and recycling collections (Roger Metcalfe)
	What are the Council's plans to preserve weekly collections for all categories of waste and recycling, and what plans does the Council have to improve provision for recycling for those residents who live in flats?

Response	 Cllr Craigie: There are no plans to change weekly collections There is no case to move to bi-weekly collections Recycling provision – there has been a trial on 500 flats on recycling food waste which has been successful, and we plan to trial this on 100 flats by the end of the year. It is a priority for us.

Answer	Cllr Campanale: GoodGym etc can also get involved in this You're right, we need to pull this all together and produce an audit

Headline Topic:	Disability access to Kew Station
Question 3	Any progress on disabled access to Kew Station?
Response	 Cllr Campanale: A year ago, Councillors had a meeting with the heritage officer from the council. We are not allowed to use the tunnel or the bridge as they are listed, so it would need a completely new bridge. We have identified 2 possible sites; however, it will cost a minimum of £3 million. South West Trains have decided that it is accessible on both sides of the station. Kew Society have looked at the station with station officers and come up with the same answers as us. Next plan is to hold an open forum with Kew residents to see if they wish to take this forward Meetings have been held with partners including the Royal Botanic Gardens Kew
	Roger Mason:

	Kew Society have applied to the Community Fund for a feasibility study for the station. Results of this are due in September
ACTION	All Councillors: Forum with Kew residents to see if they would like to take this forward – looking into fundraising ideas
Headline Topic	│ 20mph signage
Question 4	Are 20mph signs going to litter signage everywhere?
Answer	 Cllr Craigie: Street furniture has been looked at quite extensively, it was one of the reasons to have 20mph across the whole borough At every transition they must be a new sign
Headline Topic	: Sandycombe Road businesses
Question 5	I have a business in Kew. Why at Christmas time can we not get funded for lights along Sandycombe Road, currently they are only around the horseshoe. I mentioned this 5 years ago and nothing has happened. I went around Sandycombe Road and asked other business for money, but they said no.
Answer	Cllr Burford: • It is up to the traders to apply to the Town Opportunities Fund for Christmas lights
ACTION	Cllr Burford: Arrange a meeting with the local traders to discuss this
Supplementary Question	What about hanging baskets too? Everything seems to be around the horseshoe. We also need a sign to point people to Sandycombe Road shops
	Cllr Burford: • The Royal Botanic Gardens Kew are looking at new signage and we will piggy back onto this with way finding signage to Sandycombe Road
	Cllr Campanale: • The Fairtrade Forum are looking a map around Fairtrade businesses – perhaps this will help
ACTION	Cllr Burford: Arrange a meeting with the local traders to discuss this

Headline Topi	c: Hammersmith Bridge closure
Question 6	Hammersmith bridge closure is affecting the traffic in Kew. How do we ensure that Kew is not going to suffer more?
Answer	Cllr Campanale:
	Cllr Ehmann is meeting next week regarding transportation over the bridge. We are doing what we can.
Action	Cllr Campanale:
	We will raise this with Cllr Ehmann and look at what they are doing in Mortlake with the No Entry signs
Question 7	Cycle lanes - what is happening with Kew Road and cycling versus parking? Is parking going to be removed?
	Cllr Burford:
	 This is being looked at with officers, Kew Society and Royal Botanic Gardens Kew as part of the 20mph implementation
	Coach parking is being looked at too
	We are trailing electric bikes, Richmond is too far for Boris bikes. We are also looking at improving cycle lanes.
	Cllr Campanale:
	I have applied for cycle racks outside the Montessori school
Question 8	Please can you persuade the dustman to be more thorough, they are leaving litter, plastic trays etc everywhere
Answer	Cllr Craigie:
	Please call Customer Services and they will pass this onto the contractor. It will be logged as a problem
Question 9	Anti Idling – outside North Sheen station this is a terrible problem, no-one turns of their engines there. What arrangements are there in place to enforce this?
Answer	Cllr Campanale:
	Traffic wardens can fine people £40 for this
	• The implementation of 20mph means more traffic wardens for the area and we will be concentrating on these issues at
	the same time
Question 10	Also look into mobile phones usage in cars at the same time
Answer	Cllr Campanale:

	The police enforce this – perhaps we can have a joined-up approach with the police and our wardens when 20mph is instigated
ACTION	Cllr Campanale: Discuss joint approach to anti-idling and mobile phone usage in cars when 20mph is implemented
