All Clirs	Thank you to the OSO, FiSH, Mortlake Community Association and Castelnau Community Centre for all of their support during Covid'19. Residents have been fantastic at volunteering and supporting their communities too.	

Cllr Hodgins	Hammersmith Bridge Closure - TfL have put the major re-strengthen of the bridge on hold, whilst they review their finances with central government. Bridge for pedestrians and cyclists looking like 2021
Cllr Cambridge	Has been dealing with ASB along the border with Richmond Park, and issues with cycling, parking and toilets not being open during lockdown.
Cllr Joyce	Busy doing ASB patrols in East Sheen, spoke to beggars from Hammersmith. Reporting fly-tipping. Royal Parks movement strategy is open to all cyclist until the end of this week. School streets is working well.
Cllr Marcel	<ul> <li>Walking the streets to talk to businesses and support them when they can re-open. Businesses are struggling, some have adapted by doing takeaways.</li> <li>Play area near Sheen Common woods is coming along, though we will need additional funding</li> <li>Complaints re beggars that are not homeless people.</li> </ul>
Cllr Avon	<ul> <li>We need to address and adjust accordingly post lockdown; we are addressing 'pinch points' across the borough such as pavement space.</li> <li>Stag Brewery has been called in by the Mayor which we are concerned about. Issues around Chalkers Corner and transport infrastructure.</li> </ul>
Cllr Bridges-Wescott	Looking at tactile pavements and lighting around the train station
Cllr Curran	<ul> <li>Been working on waste collection services and the easing in of the new contractors.</li> <li>Dealing with issues along the tow path with people drinking along it.</li> </ul>

Question 1	2 Phone masts were recently refused by officers. The prime minister has just declared that masts no longer need	
	planning permission. Will the council offer an article 4 direction, so masts will still require planning permission?	
	Cllr Hodgins: My understanding is the new rules are around 5G and that new masts still require planning permission.	
	Where masts already exist, taller 5G masts can be replaced. Government still need to do a technical consultation on	
	this. The Council are looking into whether an article 4 direction would work.	
	Cllr Marcel: This relates to 5G, which we need, but not at the expense of infrastructure. Grey area if it is a Huawei mast	
	due to government concerns.	
Response	Cllr Cambridge: I did put in a letter against these masts as residents asked me to.
