Question 3	During the lockdown there has been as increased appreciation of cleanliness of air and birdsong, but disabled residents missed out on this in Bushy Park. Is there plans for future disabled access provision for the disabled eg the water gardens?
Response	Cllr. Saunders: At present Royal Parks are trailing a 6 month no through traffic in Bushy Park. There will be a consultation in Novembers on through traffic in the park by Royal Parks. Companion Cycling exists in Bushy Park for disabled access to bikes in the park. Aware that the gate to the Water gardens is also very restrictive.
