Councillor	Achievements			
Cllr Burford	 12 month E-Scooter trial in place as part of the London Mayors finding greener ways of transport. 5 London Boroughs are taking part. The reason LBRuT got involved in the trial is because it gives both the Council and residents a say in what we think of E-Scooters. CPZ zone KC has been implemented. We will be further consulting with zones KA and KB as they will be 			
	 impacted by this. Brentford FC is now a premiership football club 			
	Introduction of yellow lines on dropped kerbs – people that have asked for this, they will start to be implemented soon			
	 Cycle lane in Kew Road – data shows that the take up for this is very good and it is popular. As Councillors we are keeping a close eye on this. 			
	 TfL's ULEZ will start in October which will divide Kew up. We have had many discussions with TfL over this, but they are not hanging their minds on the ULEZ boundary. 			
	 Kew Green is now part of the new one-way system which we are trialling. At the moment it seems to be going ok. 			

- Graffiti has been a big pandemic since lockdown. The two footbridges were attacked a few days ago, which
 has been reported. Hyde Park Road Bridge graffiti we have been working with Network Rail and Kew
 Society to take over the painting of the bridge. NWR have supplied the paint and given us permission to
 paint the bridge.
- The fire at Townmead it has taken slightly longer to get that back up and running. Townmead will be open again soon, just one issue with some of the roofing to be sorted. You will still have to book a slot.
- Kew library should be re-opening soon.
- Kew Gardens Station and step free access we are working with Kew Society on this. It will cost approx.
 £13 million to put a lift in.
- Great community feel at Kew Plaza, with tables and chairs out
- Let's welcome, Revd Dr Melanie Harrington of The Barn Church to Kew

Headline Topic	CPZ at Forest and Priory Road
Question 2	CPZ at Forest and Priory Road has made it more difficult to park at KA as our CPZ hours are 10 -12pm.
	Cllr Burford: Both KA and KB were consulted at the same time. Residents said they didn't want the CPZ extended.
Response	However, we will be re-consulted with KA and KB in September.

Response	Cllr Campanale: Please right to me and I will speak to the tree officer and find out what's happened.

Question 6	Can we extend the cycle lane up to Kew Bridge?
