## SUSTAINABLE CONSTRUCTION CHECKLIST SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT (SPD)

## **ADOPTION STATEMENT**

In accordance with Regulation 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, notice is hereby given that the updated Sustainable Construction Checklist Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) was formally adopted by the Council on 12 January 2016.

This SPD forms part of the assessment for planning applications for new build, conversion and retrofit properties. It engages and informs developers on sustainable construction and design issues, and helps planning applicants to comply with the Council's sustainable construction standards. The update has been carried out to reflect changes in national and regional policies and guidance in relation to sustainability standards. It supersedes the previous Sustainable Construction Checklist SPD which was last updated in 2011.
